VETERANS DAY TIMELINE

November 11, 1918 = World War I ends on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month = Armistice Day.

November 11, 1919 = the first anniversary of the end of WWI = Armistice Day

<u>1938</u> = Armistice Day becomes a national holiday, and people in the USA remember all WWI veterans, living and dead.

<u>1954</u> = Armistice Day becomes Veterans Day. People remember veterans of all wars, living and dead.

<u>1971</u> = The Veterans Day Holiday moves from November 11 to the fourth Monday in October.

<u>1975</u> = The Veterans Day Holiday moves back to November 11.
